The calendar shows each month through an image.


This is not suitable for someone who wants to make notes, this is for someone who is particular about their interior design

Japan gets hotter from July. The mirage that floats above asphalt is a summer feature of Japan.




September

September is also the typhoon season. It is the season when you feel the end of summer with rain.




November

It is the season when the dead leaves are coloured, the dead leaves fall, and you feel the coming of winter. The November graphic has branches as a motif.




August
